LETTER FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

To say 2020 was a challenging year would be an understatement. What began as a new decade full of promise, quickly clouded with the death of an NBA legend, uncertainty over a growing global pandemic, a tumultuous political environment, and the unspeakable deaths of Breonna Taylor and George Floyd.

Many of us were fortunate enough to shelter in place. Our biggest issues were figuring out what to watch on Netflix (after taking the roller coaster journey that was Tiger King) or setting up our new home office. Many others weren't as fortunate. Over 22 million jobs were lost, more than 500 thousand Americans lost their lives since the start of the COVID-19 pandemic, our health care system was strained and frontline workers exhausted, and our country seemed to only agree on the fact that we all disagree.

Despite the struggles of 2020, I am optimistic that our resilient nature will prevail - and help all of us grow to be better leaders, friends, and community members.



The next generation of PGN members gives me hope that we will continue to be empathetic and understanding of different perspectives and backgrounds. One

example of this is how our college campuses came together back in June of 2020, to raise over \$9,000 for the Equal Justice Initiative in a matter of days. This is proof of what we can accomplish if we continue to approach problems together, as a team.

We also began a broader Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion journey at the national level in November. This effort will allow PGN to continue to evolve and ensure that the processes and programming in place provide a welcoming home for all members.

There is endless opportunity for us to

improve and I am excited for what comes next on our journey.

COUNCIL TRANSITIONS:



NATIONAL CONVENTION 2021

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, we hosted the National Convention entirely virtual this year. **Running a virtual convention allowed us to extend an invite to the entire active organization and alumni base for the first time.** The convention is normally hosted over the course of a weekend and focuses on leadership skills for chapter executive boards. **This year, all attendees were able to choose from 40+ sessions over the course of six days.** Sessions covered topics ranging from entrepreneurship, to marketing, leadership, networking, and financial management. EMBRACING MENTAL AND PHYSICAL WELLNESS



We're excited to welcome 287 new members to the PGN family in Spring 2021!

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DE&I TASK FORCE

Launched this past November, the PGN DE&I Task Force was responsible for assisting PGN Nationals in its effort to evolve training and education around Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion initiatives at the National and Chapter Level. Over the course of three months, the task force ran a national level survey, reviewed existing requirements, and examined processes to identify where PGN has room to grow.

TeamThink, from Cornell University, won over the panel and \$2,500 in grant money with their **plan to tackle the challenge of effectively evaluating teamwork during new member interviews**. INTRODUCING TEAMTHINK

The first automated group interview application...

...that evaluates candidates based on collaboration, teamwork, and problem-solving.

SHARK TANK UPDATE:

Since presenting in February 2021, TeamThink has...

- Assembled a team of front-end and back-end developers
- Conducted user interviews with multiple schools
- Completed initial application screens for end-user interface
- Began developing administrative screens for PGN chapters to monitor applicants' status
- Drafted brainteaser content questions

PROPOSED APPLICATION FEATURES

FLEXIBLE INTERVIEW SCHEDULING

Applicants can flexibly and anonymously schedule interview times without brotherhood assistance

AUTOMATED GROUP SESSIONS

TeamThink will automate brainteasers and organization specific questions to be asked to applicants

KEY ACTIONABLE METRICS

Based on the scores, candidate performance can be aggregated and sent to PGN
